
KEY FINDINGS


Mountain View students made significant reading fluency growth after *Voyager Passport*.

- Second-graders increased their weekly fluency gains to above the expected rate for a grade-level student
- Third-graders nearly doubled their weekly rate of fluency gain
- Fourth-graders more than quadrupled their weekly rate of fluency gain
- Fifth-graders more than tripled their weekly rate of fluency gain
- Sixth-graders nearly tripled their weekly rate of fluency gain



Mountain View School District chose *Voyager Passport* as the intervention program for students at risk of continued failure in reading at thirteen schools. The district implemented the program daily, five days a week and dramatically accelerated oral reading fluency rates as measured by Reading Connected Text. Oral reading fluency is a key indicator of reading skill.
