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


Introduction

Some students need additional suppport in order to read and write on-level. For these students, the transition to more complex content in middle and high school is complicated because they need significant support in vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, and other foundational skills.

This adolescent reading crisis leads to a high risk of dropping out of school. Students get discouraged and fall further behind until they see no way to catch up to their peers; no way to move forward.

However, research shows that if students get the right instruction, provided in the best way to meet their unique needs, they can learn, progress, and succeed.







Reading Experts Agree Adolescent Literacy Instruction Should:

- Be driven by continuous formative assessments and progress-monitoring data
- Provide explicit instruction in literacy-related foundational skills
- Honor the students' entering skill levels without insulting their age or interests
- Include a focus on higher-level thinking to promote engagement
- Teach the structure and functions of language and provide opportunities for extended discussion of text meaning and interpretation
- Use direct, systematic lessons organized by a logical scope and sequence
- Teach word-analysis techniques

- Provide opportunities for students to build fluency through practice and repeated readings
- Directly pre-teach critical vocabulary that is essential to reading new text
- Explicitly teach comprehension-monitoring techniques
- Carefully scaffold instruction to help the student become more independent
- Provide choice to students to increase motivation and active engagement, and to instill student accountability
- Involve students in peer-mediated learning
- Support language development for English Language Learners

Using Active Learning to Engage and Motivate Learners



Interactive and High-Interest Content Motivates Adolescents

LANGUAGE! Live is unique. Its peer tutorial videos, personal avatars, elements of social learning, high-interest text and topics, and peer collaboration ensure student engagement. By harnessing technology, students are motivated and encouraged by their own learning process, developing a self-awareness of their own growth. The program's content is age appropriate, relevant, and encourages peer interaction. For most students not reading at grade level, reading is not enjoyable because it is difficult. However, the amount of time students spend reading for leisure is correlated to reading achievement. Students who have not enjoyed the act of reading need to feel they have a choice in selecting reading material to make the activity more meaningful. ReadingScape, an online library of multimedia-enhanced titles built into LANGUAGE! Live, is specifically meant to encourage self-selected, independent reading.

Who Benefits from LANGUAGE! Live?

Learning Strategies for using *LANGUAGE! Live* with English Language Learners

It is possible to build language vocabulary while working on foundational literacy skills. However, it is particularly difficult for English Learners in grades 5–12 because they are learning to master foundational skills while moving into more complex content areas. Here are some learning strategies to help their transition and growth:

• Model proper language usage and provide time for processing the responses for rehearsal and repetition (I do, we do, you do)

- Provide daily opportunities to talk, talk, and more talk
- Facilitate receptive language
 - Self-talk: teacher describes what he/she is doing
 - Parallel talk: teacher describes what the student is doing
- Facilitating expressive language
 - Recast: teacher repeats what the student inaccurately says with a correct model
 - Expansion: teacher adds more grammatical structures such as adjectives and adverbs to simple sentences so that English Learners might express them
- Provide writing opportunities to extend student learning and understanding

English language development and literacy development must work together for English Learners to become proficient in reading and writing in English. Students who are proficient readers and writers of English are much more likely to graduate from high school.
