

Tip Sheet for Virtual Schooling



The impact of the coronavirus pandemic has forced schools function in a variety of instructional designs; remote, hybrid and face to face. Accessing Teacher Resources



Interactive Whiteboard (IWB) Activities for Levels A and B


Purpose: IWB activities are online tools designed to assist you in implementing Kindergarten and First Grade level instruction of phonemic awareness, phonics, and word families utilizing grade-appropriate graphic organizers, key word letter cards, letter cards, etc.

Directions

- 1. Login to Passport through the VPORT teacher portal with the username and password assigned to you through Voyager Sopris. Your login will default to the Home page.
- 2. From the Home page, click on the **Tools** tab.




3. Within the **Tools** tab, choose your level of instruction and then which activity you would like to utilize. The hyperlink for those activities will open up the respective whiteboard platform.



4. Click on the icon to access the "Interactive Whiteboard Tools" html document.



5. "The IWB Tools" document details each specific tool, its functionality, and its use within the Interactive Whiteboard platform to support your Word Works instruction.



6. Then proceed with the intended activity using the various tools for graphic organizers, phonics, phonemic awareness and/or word families, etc. Implement in conjunction with the Word Works component of your Passport instruction. Utilize the embedded word letter cards, etc. as they coincide with the explicit teacher instructions.




The Support Tab

Purpose: The resources in the Support tab allow you to maximize all components in Voyager Passport.

From the Home page, click on the **Support** tab.



Consider this "Passport's Playground." Notice the subtabs – Video, Library, FAQs – chock full of tips and hints and resources. There are support documents and videos and checklists. Take some time to explore!



Passport eBooks

Purpose: The eBooks provide digital teacher and student instructional materials to assist in planning for and delivering instruction.

From the Home page, click on the **eBooks** icon.



Once inside the eBooks platform, you will be able to access all available digital instructional components for the level of Passport that you teach. Below are examples of Passport A (Kindergarten) and B (First Grade) and some of the items that are accessible in eBooks.




Specific items to consider that would be helpful in your distance learning experience include, but are not limited to, Reteach Lessons, Extension Lessons, and Student Fluency Readers. *Level C shown below.*



Home Connection

Purpose: Home Connection activities help bridge learning from school to home. They also provide students opportunities to build fluency on previously read passages by reading aloud to a new audience outside of direct instruction from the teacher.

Reference to the Home Connection activity is found in Lessons 5 and 10.



Voyager Passport Sample Daily Schedule (30 minutes)

Assumptions:

- Use of Teacher's Edition and student materials
- 30-minute increments daily or every other day (depending on homeschool/remote learning schedule)
- One lesson per session

Remember:

- Prepare for the lessons in advance to maximize instruction and student success.
- Use the structured dialogue in the lessons to deliver each lesson with integrity.
- Rely on the To Correct procedures throughout the lesson to ensure student mastery of skills.
- Utilize the embedded ELL strategies and Teacher Tips to further enhance student learning.
- Provide differentiated instruction for students through Extra Practice opportunities.
- Integrate the **Science** and **Social Studies Connection** activities into the lesson.
- Complete the **Adventure Checkpoints** (Lessons 5 and 10).
- **HAVE FUN!** Students take their cues from their instructor. Give their instruction meaning and purpose.

Maintaining Student Engagement

- Make contact with students and parents before the lessons begin to ensure they know the schedule and how to log in.
- Create an introductory activity to get students comfortable.
- Share with students how they will respond to you and the lesson on the platform.
- Provide opportunities for learner interaction during the lesson....varies by age.
- Encourage sharing and active participation.
